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## Introduction

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### Purpose

The purpose of this document is to suggest an interim RAPID® Pathway and important changes to the programme structure. After 30 June 2009, the RAPID® Pathway will undergo complete re-scoping to align it with the outcomes of the CDEM Competency Framework. The CDEM Competency Framework is a collection of evidence-based competencies and indicators developed in consultation with CDEM stakeholders.

**Important note:** the information contained within this document will not be valid after 30 June 2009.

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### The National CDEM Framework

The Civil Defence Emergency Management Act (2002) provides for a comprehensive and integrated approach to civil defence emergency management across the 4Rs, involving all sectors of government, private enterprise, communities and individuals. Central to the CDEM environment is a need for all those engaged in enhancing community resilience to be suitably trained and competent to meet the needs of their communities during emergencies.

The CDEM Act (2002) places a statutory obligation upon all CDEM Groups to *"...take all steps necessary on an ongoing basis to maintain and provide, or to arrange the provision of suitably trained and competent personnel, including volunteers, and an appropriate organisational structure for those personnel, for effective civil defence emergency management in its area"* [Section 17, 1(b)].

The National CDEM Strategy is the Crown's vision for civil defence emergency management in New Zealand. Goal 3, Objective B of the Strategy is specifically focused towards enhancing the ability of CDEM to *"prepare for and manage emergencies"*. As part of this goal, RAPID® was introduced to the CDEM sector in April 2004 as a step towards achieving this objective.

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### Role of MCDEM

MCDEM exists to:

- provide strategic policy advice on New Zealand's capability to manage and be resilient to the social and economic costs of disasters
- ensure the establishment of structures to provide the capability to manage and respond to disasters in New Zealand
- provide support to sector stakeholders in their delivery of civil defence emergency management
- ensure a co-ordinated approach, at both national and community level to planning for reduction, readiness, response, and recovery;
- manage central government response and recovery functions for large scale events that are beyond the capacity of local authorities.

MCDEM is a member of the LGITO CDEM Advisory Group.

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**Role of LGITO** LGITO has been involved in the development of unit standards and qualifications in civil defence emergency management for over seven years. The LGITO CDEM Advisory Group is responsible for the development and review of unit standards and National Certificates designed to set standards for, and measure achievement of, skills in CDEM.

As part of its obligations as the standard setting body, LGITO monitors the quality of training and assessment against unit standards throughout New Zealand and works with MCDEM to review and maintain RAPID®.

LGITO will continue to use its subscription system to administer access to CDEM unit standards and National Certificates. LGITO oversees the development of unit standards and national qualifications for the CDEM sector.

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## Overview of RAPID®

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**Background** RAPID® was introduced to CDEM stakeholders in April 2004. A national training needs analysis was undertaken in 2003 based on a modified role-mapping model that identifies the roles of CDEM response personnel, the frequency with which emergency response tasks occur, and the depth of complexity for such tasks. These roles and their associated competencies have been collated to form the RAPID® Pathway. The Pathway provides a logical progression of competencies for civil defence emergency management activity at an operational level.

RAPID®, provides nationally consistent training modules, including self-paced and course based formats. Developed in a partnership between the Ministry of Civil Defence & Emergency Management (MCDEM) and the Local Government Industry Training Organisation (LGITO), the RAPID® modules are of significant interest to agencies engaged in civil defence emergency management.

The RAPID® training framework is intended for CDEM responders (operators in the response phase).

The aim of RAPID® is to ensure that responder-level training is consistently delivered throughout the country to enhance resilience and interoperability between CDEM Groups and agencies.

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**Self-paced format** Completion of the self-paced modules may require on-job training and practical activities. Students must complete the assessment evidence workbook for each module they are completing, which is provided electronically on the LGITO website [www.lgito.org.nz](http://www.lgito.org.nz) or the RAPID® compact discs issued in 2004.

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**Course-based format** Courses are delivered by a range of training providers. Training providers may include the CDEM Group Training Office, or be an NZQA-accredited Private Training Establishment or a Polytechnic. Government organisations and non-profit bodies may also become deliverers of RAPID® modules.

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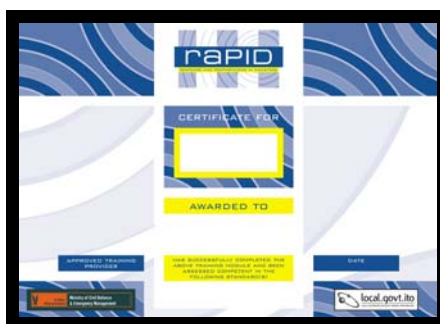
**Attendance certificates**

Training providers may issue their own organisational certificate to indicate learners' attendance at courses that utilise RAPID® training or assessment materials. It should be noted that attendance-based training is not sufficient to meet legislative requirements under section 17(1)(b) of the Civil Defence Emergency Management Act 2002, and therefore RAPID® certificates must not be issued for attendance-only training. Such attendance-based certificates may not bear the logos of the Ministry of Civil Defence & Emergency Management, Local Government Industry Training Organisation, or RAPID®.

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**RAPID® module certificate**

RAPID® Module Certificates will be issued upon completion of individual modules, including formal assessment to the level of the unit standard. The certificate is issued by the training provider on pre-printed stock available from LGITO, PO Box 1214, Wellington.



**RAPID® Industry Certificates**

Upon completion of a group of specified unit standards, the learner can apply to LGITO to be awarded a RAPID® Industry Certificate.



**NZQA National Certificates**

RAPID® Industry Certificates build towards the attainment of the National Certificate in Civil Defence Response (Level 2). Details about this qualification can be found on NZQA's web site [www.nzqa.govt.nz](http://www.nzqa.govt.nz). This National Certificate will be shown on the learner's NZQA Record of Learning.

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**Version changes to unit standards**

New learners must start, and be assessed on, the latest version of the unit standard. The materials for these can be found on the LGITO website [www.lgito.org.nz](http://www.lgito.org.nz). For questions about unit standard versions contact LGITO on phone 04 924 1240.

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# Training Management

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**Introduction** Although RAPID® provides a framework of training modules, to be successful it does require effective training management on the part of the provider.

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**Analysis** A training needs analysis will identify the gap between required performance and actual performance. In the civil defence emergency management context, the performance of CDEM responders should be consistent with their responsibilities under the CDEM Group Plan.

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**Preparation** Once it is known what the needs are, it becomes possible to start planning to enhance capability. The development of a Strategic Training Plan (3-5 years) at CDEM Group/organisation level should be considered. This gives the CDEM Group or organisation a mid-term plan dealing with “what training should be delivered to whom, to what level, by when and why it is needed”. This can then be developed into an annual training plan detailing who is leading the training, where, and what the costs are.

There are many things that should be considered in a plan, including previous plan reviews, revalidations of unit standards (e.g first aid), skills maintenance of trainers, refresher courses, exercises, introduction of new technology or procedures, national courses, and external courses that may be of interest. Preparation also includes the development of training sessions and exercises as required.

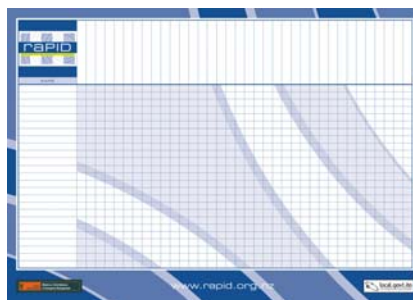
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**Industry Training Fund** LGITO is able to access the Tertiary Education Commission’s Industry Training Fund. CDEM Groups that elect to enter into a training agreement with the employees undertaking training towards a National Certificate will be entitled to a rebate on the LGITO CDEM Group subscription fee.

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## RAPID® Pathway Structure

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### Structure

The RAPID® Pathway is an adult education programme covering topics relevant to responding to and being prepared for disasters. The programme (Pathway) consists of two strands: Core Skills, and Operations.

The Core Skills strand identifies the basic skills and knowledge that any CDEM responder requires, regardless of their role. These skills are grouped together to form the RAPID® Certificate in Emergency Preparedness; this certificate is a prerequisite to the range of certificates in the Operations strand.

The Operations strand covers a range of specific operational skills and knowledge that learners may undertake or require in a CDEM emergency. The skills and knowledge acquired by completing modules/certificates builds on those acquired by completing the Core Skills strand.

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### Levels of engagement

RAPID® works on two levels of engagement. Although RAPID® contains many registered unit standards, it is not registered as a qualification on the National Qualifications Framework (NQF). RAPID® modules can be credited towards a National Certificate.

Level 1 engagement means that the basic skills and knowledge are introduced and competency is formally gauged, but the learner is not credited with NZQA unit standards. This level of engagement is not eligible for Industry Training Funding.

Level 2 engagement means learners undergo competency-based assessment under the NZQA National Qualifications Framework, working towards a RAPID® Industry Certificate or the formal qualification of a National Certificate. This level of engagement is eligible for Industry Training Funding from LGITO, if learners are signed to a LGITO training agreement with their CDEM Group.

Different levels of engagement allow for CDEM Groups to develop capability appropriate to their risk, funding and resources, while still maintaining a national standard based on a minimum level of engagement.

RAPID® is an optional resource for CDEM Groups to deliver and assess training. The assessment process to establish competency is quality assured through LGITO and externally moderated by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority. Alternatively, Groups may develop their own process for judging competency; however, this may be a time-intensive process. The level of engagement is determined by the CDEM Group.

## RAPID® Certificate in Emergency Rescue

**Purpose** The purpose of this qualification is to provide training for personnel who provide General Rescue and/or Urban Search & Rescue (Structural Collapse), in accordance with section 85(1)(b) of the CDEM Act 2002.

**Notes** Upon completion of this Certificate the learner is also eligible for the USAR Response Certificate and Responder Orange Card, available from [www.frsito.org.nz](http://www.frsito.org.nz).

**Exemptions** Learners holding *10618 Rescue casualties using rescue techniques* are exempt from completing unit standard 7318.

Learners holding *14470 Provide enhanced life support* and *14471 Provide enhanced first aid* are exempt from completing unit standards 6400, 6401, and 6402.

## RAPID® Certificate in Emergency Transportation

**Purpose** The purpose of this certificate is to provide training for Civil Defence Emergency Management personnel responding to emergencies by road vehicles or aircraft.
